Annual Dinner

Sadly, the 2018 event was not well supported and, consequently, was down from the previous year. Each year Allen Hall has increased the cost, not by a lot, but it has gone up annually. As a result, we always make a loss – last year it was £130. As CAA are now being upgraded and undergoing a huge amount of work, including the installation of a well-needed lift, Michael has proposed that we book that venue for this year's Annual Dinner. He has spoken with their Catering Manager who has quoted a cost of £26 per person for a 3-course meal. There will be waiters at no added cost. The hall can accommodate 50 people and the bar will be extended as well, so lots more room there too.
