At the close of the play Lloyd Wilde, who has been closely associated with CRISIS for many years, gave an inspiring talk about what **CRISIS** is and does. She is a fervent supporter and works extremely hard on their behalf. I am more than happy to say that, thanks to the incredible generosity of the audience, CaAPA raised the princely sum of £360 for CRISIS. Thanks must go to the cast, the inspiring Director, Kenneth Michaels, to Terry Perkins who was responsible for some incredible sound effects, who all gave freely of their time to rehearse not just once but twice and last, but by no means least, to the playwright, Michael Harrington. I can only imagine the amount of time he spent on this play but it was well worth it. It attracted a full house to the CAA and the length of the applause at the end showed just how much the audience appreciated and enjoyed it.
